

Every year countless dogs and cats are lost due to lack of proper identification. Millions of dogs and cats, horses, livestock and birds now carry microchips. Wildlife and endangered species, reptiles and even fish are being studied and managed with the aid of this great technology.

The tiny injectable "chip" contains a one-of-a-kind identification number and is recognized worldwide. A scanner is used to read the microchip through the skin of the animal. The animal feels nothing as the chip's number quickly appears in the scanner's viewing window. This provides a permanent positive identification that cannot be lost, altered or intentionally removed with the added security of an international database which operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It is a safe, simple and inexpensive way to protect your pet against loss or theft.



STAYING COOL DURING HOT WEATHER AT THE BARK

We know you and your four-footed best buddy want to have the best of times at the Bark. So it's important to remember that dogs are not as good as people in getting rid of excess body heat. Dogs do not sweat like people do to cool off. They are able to shed a very small amount of body heat by panting and sweating through the pads of their paws. So it is important to watch your dog during the hot weather and keep him safe. Never, Ever, Leave Your Dog in the Car on a Hot Day. Cars heat up much quicker than you realize, even with the windows open. It's best to leave your dog at home on a hot day, when you do your errands. Heatstroke can be very damaging and a dog that has had it once can be prone to getting it again.

Some Symptoms of Heatstroke Are

Rapid or heavy breathing • Bright red tongue • Thick saliva • Vomiting Legs, ears, hot to the touch • Bloody diarrhea • Unsteadiness • Hot, dry nose

Extreme Symptoms are glassy-eyed, gray lips

If you feel your dog has become overheated and possibly suffering from heatstroke you should do the following:

Gradually wet your dog using cool, not cold water.

Get him out of direct sunlight

Give your dog very small amounts of cool water to drink.

Get your dog to a veterinarian as soon as possible.

Kyva Sundances Teaching Backtrack to Your Toy

How good is your dog's memory? Challenge him to remember the location \swarrow of his toy, and then go back to find it.

- 1 Show your dog his favorite toy (or food toy, or bowl with food in it) and set it on the ground. Point it out to him a few times and tell him to remember where it is.
- 2 Use a leash to walk him a short distance (about 30 feet) away from the toy.
- 3 Excitedly say, "Find it!" and maybe even point toward the toy. Let your dog run back to the toy or food bowl and get his reward. Next, place the toy in a new location and walk your dog farther away from the toy and try again.

WHAT TO EXPECT: Build distance gradually so your dog can be successful and won't get discouraged. Eventually you may be able to backtrack a few hundred feet.







1 Put his toy on the ground and tell him to remember where it is.

2 Walk him about 30 feet (10 meters) away. 3 Tell your dog to "find it!" and let him run back to the toy.

The CGC Test is to demonstrate that the dog, as a companion of man, can be a respected member of the community, and can be trained and conditioned to always behave in the home, in public places, and in the presence of other dogs in a manner that will reflect credit on the dog. To qualify, a dog must pass each of the ten test categories listed below:

Accepting a Friendly Stranger, Sitting Politely for Petting, Appearance and Grooming, Out for a Walk (walking on loose leash), Walking Through a Crowd, Sit and Down on Command/Staying in Place, Coming when Called, Reaction to Another Dog, Reactions to Distractions, Supervised Separation
